Gallbladder Removal Surgery: Side Effects and Complications

The most common reason for gallbladder removal surgery is to treat gallstones. With laparoscopic surgery, patients are usually able to leave the hospital the same day as the procedure and be back to normal in as little as two weeks. With open surgery, patients typically stay in the hospital for 1 to 2 days. It may take 6 to 8 weeks for a full recovery.

How Long Is the Recovery from Gallbladder Surgery?

The gallbladder is a pear-shaped sac that measures around 7 to 10 cm long, with an average capacity of 30 to 50 mL. When obstructed, the gallbladder can distend markedly and contain up to 300 mL of fluid. The gallbladder is located in an anatomic fossa on the inferior surface of the liver.

Surgery Overview. Laparoscopic gallbladder surgery (cholecystectomy) removes the gallbladder and gallstones through several small cuts (incisions) in the abdomen. The surgeon inflates your abdomen with air or carbon dioxide in order to see clearly. The surgeon inserts a lighted scope attached to a video camera (laparoscope) into one incision near the belly button.
