NSSO's 69th round found that there were 33,510 slums in the country, out of that 13,761 were notified and 19,749 were non- notified slums, It means , the growth of slums was faster than the notification process of the government. As per Census- 2011 data there were 65.49 million inhabitants living in 13.92 million households in slums.
