In being persecuted, he was not singular; the author of Mercurius Civicus(May, 1643-December, 1646) and The Kingdomes Weekly Intelligencer(January, 1643-October, 1649) shared the like fate. Mercurius Civicuswas suppressed for its too outspoken loyalty to its king. The writer of these periodicals is known only by his initials R. C.

Mercurius Britanicus and Kingdomes Weekly Intelligencer appear to have operated a pact whereby the former concentrated on propaganda while recommending the Intelligencer to its readers for detailed, accurate, factual reporting (Mercurius Britanicus, xxii, 12 Feb. 1644, 175; xxiii, 19 Feb. 1644, 180).
